






SHSU Easter Service Brings Together Christian Groups (4/15/19)

College UM ARMY in Athens, TX May 19—25, 2019

This year for College UM ARMY, dozens of college students and older adults gathered in Athens, TX for their week-long mission camp. What made this College UM ARMY Camp unique was the amount of wheelchair ramps that were built for kids with cerebral palsy. Every dollar mattered, since a wheelchair ramp cost can range between \$900 to \$1,500, depending on the size and length. We built 5 of them! Four were for kids with special needs, and another for a fantastic 80-years-young veteran. Two other families with special needs kids were also helped. We also cleaned out lots of debris and filled a dumpster in just two days. Payne Springs UMC stepped up as an outpost for us to use, thus reducing our trip distance and time to the dumpster. We helped the Athens Food Pantry, and collaborated well with local ministries. In all, our UM ARMY Camp served 14 clients with 5 work teams! An impressive
